



Mr. Toriyama created “*Dragon Ball*” in November, 1984. ( His **previous** work, “*Dr. Slump*”, was just finished in August of the same year!) Mr. Toriyama borrowed the name and ideas of the monkey God from “*the Journey to the West*” to design the main character “*Goku*” at first, but he soon added Kong Fu, boxing arena, and enemies from other planets to make the story a totally different style. A lot of great scenes in “*Dragon Ball*” such as “changing hair color when getting more powerful” are the strongest inspiration to later and younger comic artists and the coolest memories to fans. Sadly, Mr. Toriyama **passed away** in March, 2024. Some said if the dragon balls do exist, the only wish they would make is to bring Mr. Toriyama back to life.

When it comes to AI, people are most likely to know ChatGPT, which has made people all over the world excited and curious. In fact, ChatGPT is an AI robot that can understand and respond to users in no time through texting key words. When used for learning, ChatGPT can provide great feedback, explanations and relevant resources according to each user's questions. \_\_\_①\_\_\_, although ChatGPT appears to be quite powerful, its responses have raised several problems sometimes.

\_\_\_②\_\_\_, the most common problem is that the answers provided by ChatGPT aren't always correct. ChatGPT's responses are based on patterns of information it has learned from a great deal of text data. While it works hard to provide correct and helpful responses, it may make mistakes from time to time. Users still have to check out whether or not the information from ChatGPT is right and useful.

\_\_\_③\_\_\_, even though ChatGPT can respond to users in no time, it may lead them to depend too much on it. Some students seldom do their homework alone; instead, they depend on ChatGPT most of the time. Then, their abilities to learn by themselves, solve problems, think critically may become weaker and weaker.

What's more, many people are questioning if using ChatGPT to get homework done is an act of cheating. Some think so, while others don't. This has raised a lot of different thoughts and ideas. Besides, when learning through ChatGPT, users' emotional needs could hardly be understood. So when users feel difficulty in learning and feel sad, there's almost nothing that ChatGPT can do.

## Pay Attention!

I wonder how many of you'll read this article to the end? With our busy lifestyles and so many **distractions**, it's hard to focus on one thing and I wouldn't be surprised if I lose your attention somewhere along the way.

Some experts believe that our attention spans are getting worse. We often joke that goldfish have the shortest level of attention span so that they forget what they see in nine seconds. Now a study says that people have an even shorter span—just eight seconds. I am one of the case. There's always so much to do and so much to remember that my brain gets overloaded and I find it hard to focus.

Smartphones, the internet and social media all take up a lot of our attention. A research made from Dscout has found that we look at our smartphones for, on average, 2.42 hours every day. It's tempting to keep looking at our phones when we should focus on other things. That's why our time of concentration has been dropping.

On the other hand, some experts show different ideas about this. Dr. Gemma is one of them. She says that there are problems with the idea of measuring attention spans. It isn't always true that people control and keep their attention terribly when they carry out another job. Actually, our attention-switching ability may have developed well in the age of smartphone and internet. "We're getting better at switching our attention quickly between different jobs. This is useful in the modern workplace where we need to turn our hand to many different jobs," explained Dr. Gemma.

But for those people who try to catch our attention, such as advertisers, they will have to think of smarter ways to make us sit up and take notice of them.
