

Have you ever tried having afternoon tea with your friends in a beautiful garden or even a hotel? Do you know how to tell the difference between afternoon tea and high tea?


Although many Americans mistake high tea for afternoon tea, they are actually two very different traditions in British culture, even though both are made up of a meal with tea.
